It looks as if nothing much has been happening down at the Sk8 park for weeks now, but there has been a lot of behind the scenes activity. As all will be aware we have needed to look at the noise levels coming from the park and explore how best to make the dB readings fall within acceptable levels. This is not only for council approval but also as consideration to residents nearby.

We have engaged Sound Engineers who have carried out extensive background noise testing and recorded levels of skaters using the park. A report on this has been delivered to the Peace Park committee and concerned residents. The committee will look to follow the recommendations laid out in the report.

The first stage will be to enclose the ends and sides of the ramps with a sound-proofing material. This had always been part of the intended plan. We are also beginning to seek funding for a sound barrier wall as second stage soundworks. We would like to thank Gerhard, the Chamber of Commerce and local businesses for their generous donations. Gerhard continues to help raise funds and promote the park as a worthy youth project. Obie Hopkins and the Doof crew also made a considerable donation following the Mardi Grass, thanks guys for your ongoing support. The Premiers Dept also continues to assist and recently contributed funds to help pay for the sound report.

In the meantime the crew is completing the welds to the last sections of the ramp and will erect the sun awnings at each end of the ramps in the coming weeks.

The park will continue to be closed until all works have been completed. As we will need to apply for a DA for the wall, it could be some time before the park is completed
