

Look out for Archie's new book, it's a little beauty. Filled with the wit and wisdom he has gleaned from a very diverse range of life experiences, his collection of poems and short stories are filled with close observation of human

frailties frailties and strengths, wins and losses. In his foreword to the edition, Graeme Galt says, "You will recognise the lover, the sportsman, the traveller and a man who has learned much along the way. '

In the process of crafting these little gems, Archie has thoroughly road-tested the work: with his stories, by publishing them in the GoodTimes; and with his poetry by performing it often at poetry nights, particularly at the Nimbin Oasis cafe.

Of late he has been receiving even more accolades than usual for his work - he won the regional heat for the NSW section of the Australian Poetry Slam at Ballina recently, and at the end of November he gets flown to Sydney to compete in the state finals at the NSW State Library.
