Nimbin Skate Park noise monitoring


Rain again stopped play at the Nimbin SK8 park, even before the sound test planned for 16th December got started.

The Australian Standard for undertaking environmental noise monitoring/measurements require that measures should not be undertaken during periods of rain or winds greater than 5m/s as these can affect the results significantly.

Given this, it was recommended by the acoustic engineers engaged by the NCDA that the noise monitoring program be postponed until January 2007, with a tentative plan to perform the measurements on Friday 19th and Saturday 20th January.

Sound-level readings will be taken from 10am, and continue into the afternoon.

Look for a sign on the park fence to confirm the date, then bring your board! All local and regional skaters are invited to participate, and for the first time, try out all the ramps, whether sound-proofed or not.

Statewide award goes to local political stalwart


