Earthly Connections

Painting and Sculpture in the Hinterland Saturday 19th January – Monday 28th January

'Earthly Connections - Art for the Body, Mind and Spirit' is an exhibition by three local artists - painter - Shirley Miller; wood sculptor - Warwick Saxby; and ceramicist - Heather Kimber. The exhibition is being held at Shirley Miller's studio home at Jarlanbah Community and will incorporate some fabulous new works of paintings, wood and mixed media sculpture as well as some ceramic sculptures for the garden.

Shirley's work will feature large multi-paneled canvases as well as smaller more intimate 'found object' pieces, which reflect a new direction she is taking in her acrylic and gouache painting.

Warwick will be featuring his beautiful miniature wood carvings, which are inspired by the Japanese form, netsuke'. As well as netsuke,

he sculpts larger wooden objects and bronze, and he also makes a popular series of carved Australian animals from native woods.

Heather will be featuring a range of 'Earth Wands' and 'Earth Callers' - totem poles for the garden. These ceramic and 'found object' works are created from earth, air, fire and water and make a serene, meditative focal point for gardens.

All three artists will be available to discuss their works, and there will be ongoing demonstrations of the artists at work throughout the exhibition.

Visitors are welcome to bring a picnic lunch and relax in the gardens. Refreshments will also be available, catered by 'Di's Folly'. Opening hours are between 10 am and 5 pm
