Since then, ICAC has responded that Metgasco's share arrangements did not fall within its jurisdiction, and the company has announced the start of legal action in the Supreme Court against the NSW government over the suspension of its licence.

Metgasco still have a period of time to provide further submissions about its community consultation process, and meantime their miniscule share price, around \$0.049, could make them an attractive takeover target for larger miners.
